

World Day AIDS

After discovering that she was HIV positive, Marie Claudine started taking anti-retroviral medication. She needed to regain her strength to care for her five children, one of whom is also HIV positive.

She credits the care and support she received from Guardians of Hope for keeping her alive.

Marie Claudine also received a small loan of \$20 from the group to make a partial payment on school fees. Her son had been “chased out” of school because they could not pay. She continues to do various work, including farming, to pay the remaining fees. She has since paid back her loan and is saving what she can for her children’s future.

Hope + HIV = Living Positive

There are 69 members in her Guardians of Hope group. Together they are involved in home-based care, savings and loans - where each member contributes a small amount (around \$1/month) which is then loaned to a member.

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The deadliest part of AIDS is the stigma.

Those affected by AIDS describe life like this. "It's Shame. Disgrace. Discrimination. Hatred. Rejection. Fear. Injustice. Loneliness. Hopelessness."

AIDS is the leading cause of death worldwide for people aged 15 to 49. Today more than 32 million people are infected with the devastating disease.

Hope is the antidote

Since the launch of Guardians of Hope in 2004, there are now over 136 local church-based groups across Kenya, Rwanda and Angola. In India, new awareness initiatives and training programs have also been launched.

Guardians of Hope supports the most vulnerable - orphaned children, widows and widowers who lack family support. They provide food, clothes and care. They encourage children to stay in school and protect them from exploitation and abuse, providing spiritual counsel through the devastating illness and loss of family. Guardians of Hope also works to improve farming, water supply and health in the community, through income-generating activities and training.

Tens of thousands more are impacted through prevention and awareness activities, such as interactive drama presentations, awareness training seminars for pastors, teachers and youth and the building of clinics for counselling, testing and medical care.
