
How to Draw a Person


Follow these simple 17 steps to follow along with illustrator, Dolph Banza.

You will need paper, pencils, and erasers for this activity.




step 3: Draw a third and fourth rounded rectangle below the first two to make the lower body of your person.




step 6: Draw three rectangles to make the upper arm, forearm and palm of the hand.




STEP 1: Draw a rounded square in the top left of your paper to create the head of your person.




STEP 4: At the bottom of your person, draw two curved lines for each leg and a rectangle for each foot.



STEP 7: Using these rectangles you can give the arm any number of poses.




STEP 2: Draw a second slightly larger rounded rectangle below the first to create the torso of your person.




STEP 5: Draw two curved lines to connect the head to the torso and the torso to the lower body.




STEP 8: The hand is also made of smaller rectangles.
Each finger is made of three segments.




step 9: In this example we will be drawing a closed fist by only showing on of each finger's segments.




step 10: Next we draw an object in the closed hand. You can add any object you like.




step 11:Use a horizontal and verticle guideline through the head and use circles to create the eyes.




STEP 12: Use a line at the bottom of the head and a second half way between to find the position for the nose and ears.




between the two lower lines and eyebrows above the eyes.



STEP 14: In the video, Dolph adds a traditional head scarf to his person but you can add any headwear or hairstyle that you can think of.



STEP 15: Remember, hair isn't flat. Even straight hair has shape and volume.



step 16: Add your details to the clothing. You can add as many details as you can imagine.



step 17: Finally, remove any unwanted lines and clean up the outline. You're ready to add colour!
