

IMPACT STORY FROM INTEGRAL MISSION IN THE WORKPLACE, EAST AFRICA

Greetings from Beth Kamathi, Marketplace Engagement Coordinator for East Africa. I am deeply encouraged by how God is stirring hearts across our region—drawing people to embrace integral mission in the marketplace. It’s inspiring to witness the growing commitment to bridging the gap between Sunday faith and Monday work, and to see redemptive business initiatives taking root with purpose and passion.

General Ministry update

Over the past six months, we’ve been honored to walk alongside partners in advancing integral mission in the workplace place. The training, designed to equip church leaders and ministers to bridge the gap between Sunday and Monday, helps believers understand that all of life—from Monday to Sunday—is God’s business. In the Month of June 2025, we successfully trained 50 regional pastors from the Africa Christian Church and Schools, and 18 seminary students. In the September 2025 we shall be conducting another training with 32 (pastors and workplace ministers) from the AEBR in Rwanda.

Specific Ministry

The training was conducted with 50 regional pastors and 18 seminary students, with the hopeful anticipation that each participant will cascade the learning to pastors, leaders under their care, and members within their congregations. The sessions covered key topics such as: *Introduction to Integral Mission, Church Life During Crisis, The Church Gathered and Scattered, Is Every Member a Minister? Where Does Ministry Happen? How Does God See Work? The Work of the Lord? Supporting Workplace Ministers.* These teachings are equipping leaders to embrace and model a holistic Gospel that transforms both church and workplace.
