A Global Witness of Christ's Light



SCRIPTURE:

Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

READING:

Today we light the first candle of Advent—the candle of **Hope**.

Help us to be people of hope—here in (insert your local area), Canada, and around the globe.





READING:
